

MPSoL PUBLIC NOTICE

ON THE ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF PARALLEL DISTRIBUTION APPARATUS (MPSOWAL)

The Superior Committee of Symbolic Infrastructure Harmonics (SIHD) submits for the record the following petition, now entered into plenary consideration and herein resolved.

The entity operating under the designation MidPacific Soviet of Words and Letters (MPSoWaL) is acknowledged as an active distribution apparatus functioning in proximity to, but not within, the canonical structure of the MidPacific Soviet of Letters (MPSoL).

This apparatus demonstrates:

- Competent material production
- Functional dissemination channels
- Sustained engagement with non-archival audiences
- A preference for transactional exchange over open release

These characteristics, while divergent from MPSoL doctrine, do not constitute operational failure.

ON DOCTRINAL DIVERGENCE

MPSoL maintains its position:

That symbolic material, following Victory, is to be distributed as surplus—freely, without restriction, as part of post-collapse normalization.

MPSoWaL, by contrast, operates under a containment-through-valuation model, wherein:

- Objects are stabilized through price
- Access is mediated through transaction
- Material is framed as artifact rather than surplus

This divergence is noted. It is not, at present, subject to correction.

ON FUNCTIONAL COEXISTENCE

The Plenary recognizes that:

- Both systems contribute to symbolic persistence
- Both systems extend the lifespan of signal-bearing structures

- Both systems, in their own manner, resist total dissipation

Accordingly, MPSoWaL is designated:

A Parallel Distribution Body Under Observational Tolerance

No formal integration is proposed. No disciplinary action is recommended.

ON RECORD AND FUTURE REVIEW

This acknowledgment does not imply endorsement. It establishes:

- Visibility
- Legibility
- Archival presence

Further review may be conducted should:

- Distribution patterns shift
- Doctrinal boundaries erode
- Material degradation be observed

CLOSING REMARK

The Soviet does not require unity.
It requires continuity of form.

Where divergence preserves form, it is recorded.
Where it threatens form, it is corrected.

At present, no correction is required.
